

PHOTO ID



Georgia law requires registered voters to show photo identification in order to vote *in person*. When you vote in person, you must show one of the following photo IDs:

- A Georgia driver's license, even if expired
- Any valid state or federal government issued photo ID, including a free Voter ID Card issued by the Department of Driver Services or your county registrar's office
- Valid U.S. passport
- Valid employee photo ID from any branch, department, agency, or entity of the U.S. Government, Georgia, or any county, municipality, board, authority, or other entity of this state
- Valid U.S. military photo ID
- Valid tribal photo ID

If you **DO NOT** have one of these forms of photo ID, you can receive a free Georgia Voter ID Card. Just contact your county registrar's office or a Department of Driver Services office.

If you have to vote a provisional ballot because you do not have one of the forms of photo ID listed above, you can go to your county registrar's office get a free Voter ID Card and present it within two days after the election and your provisional ballot will be counted.
